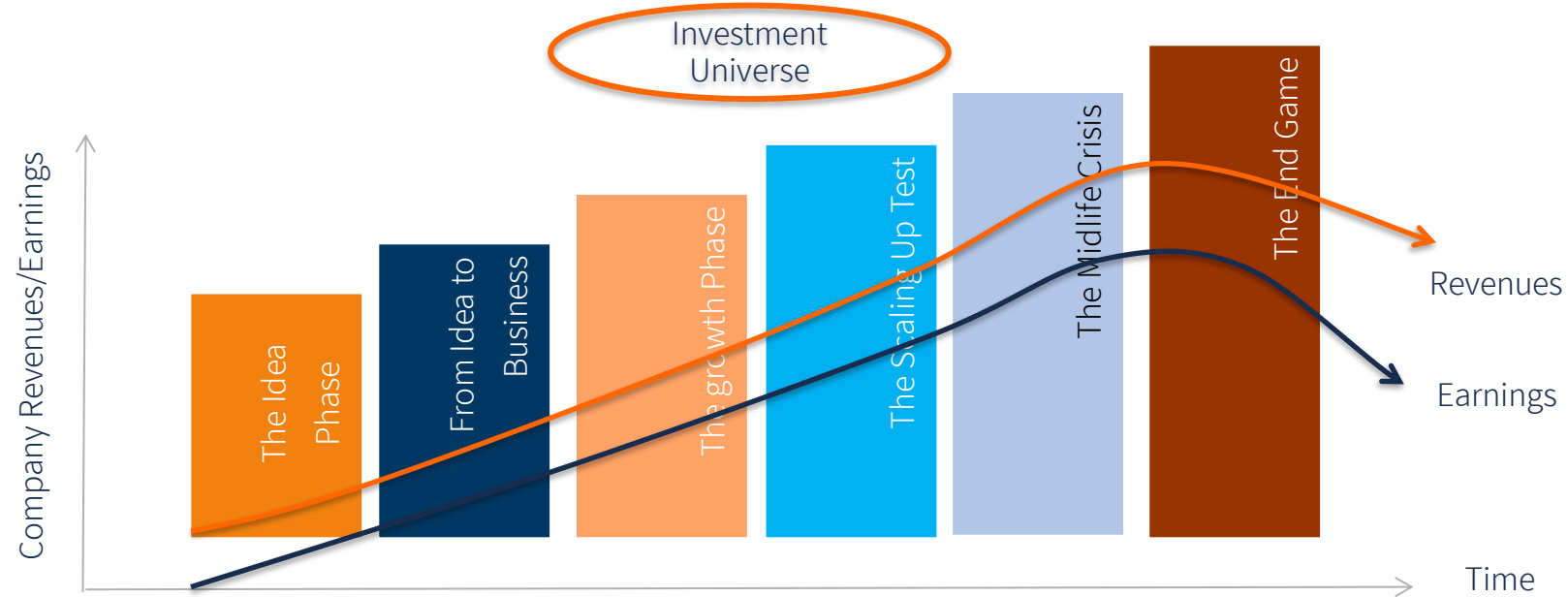

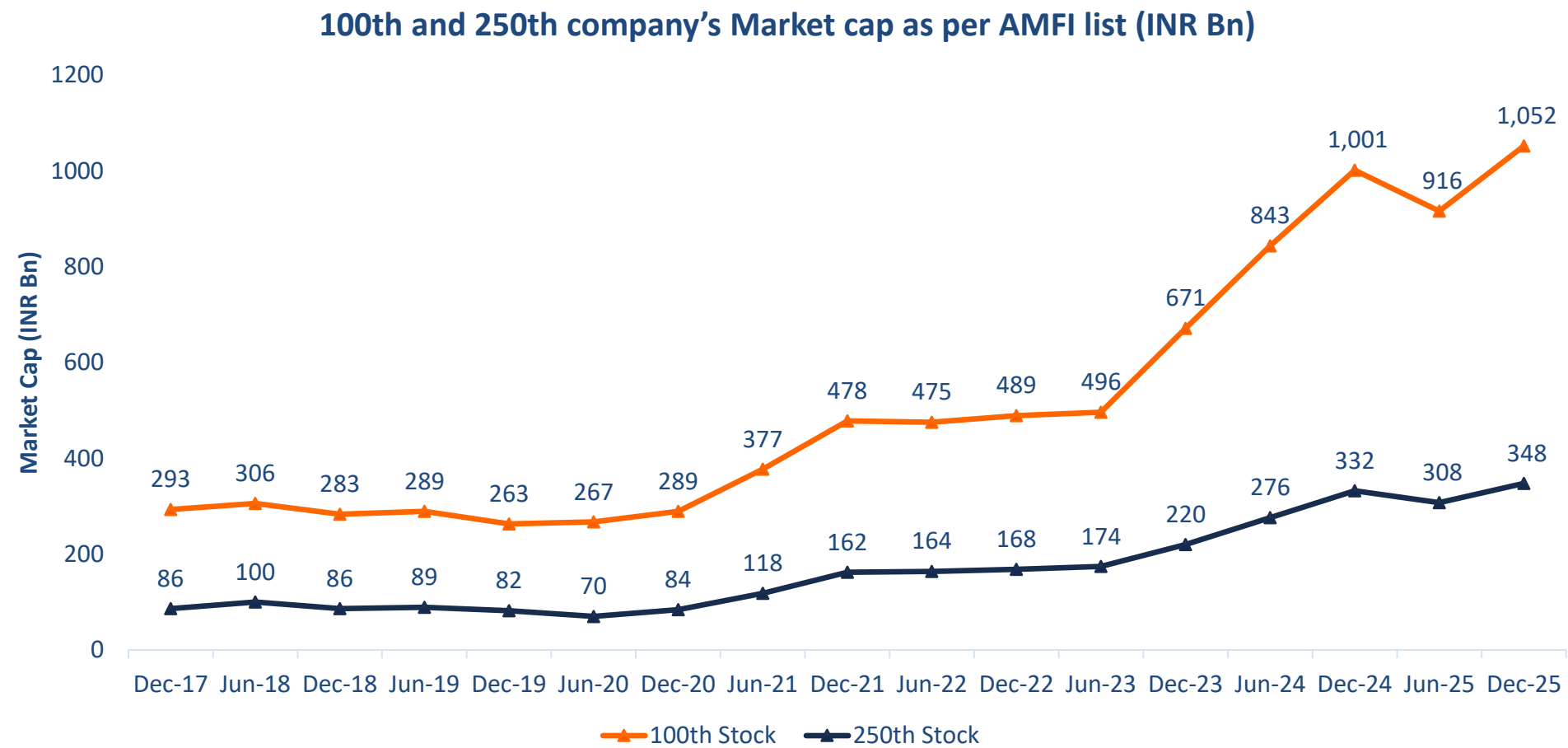

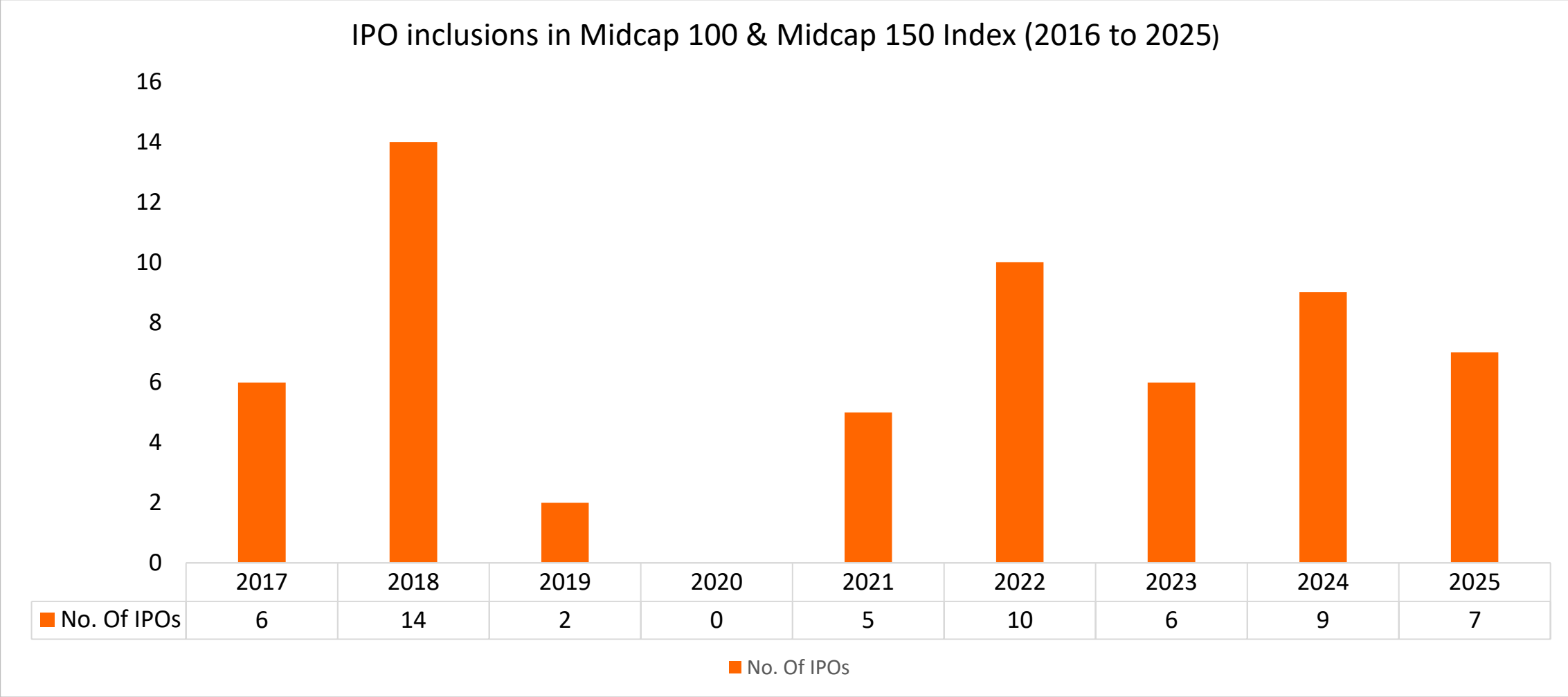

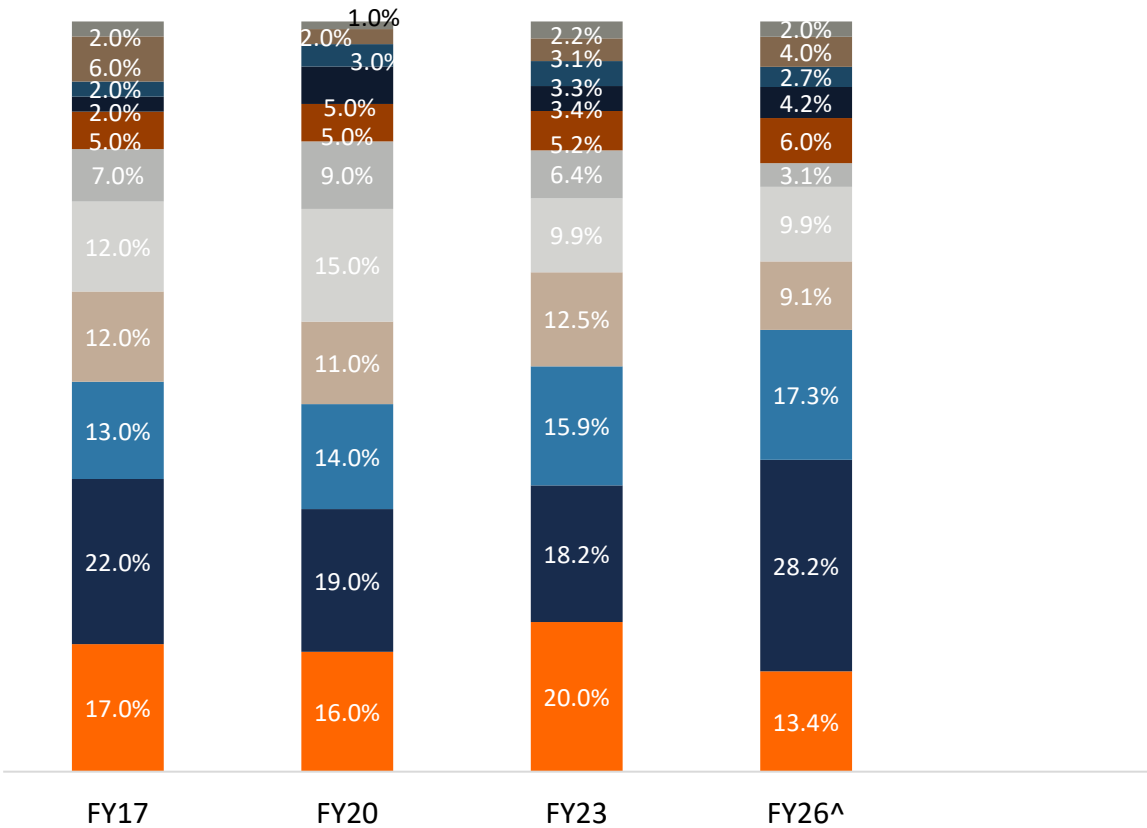

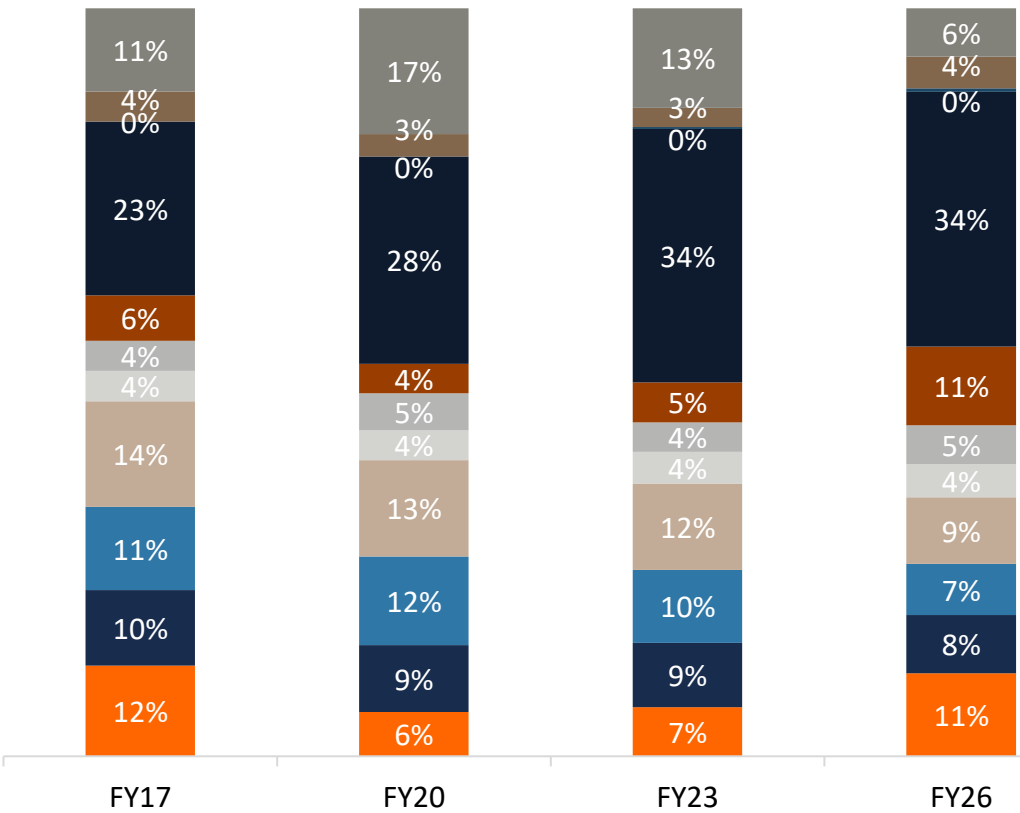

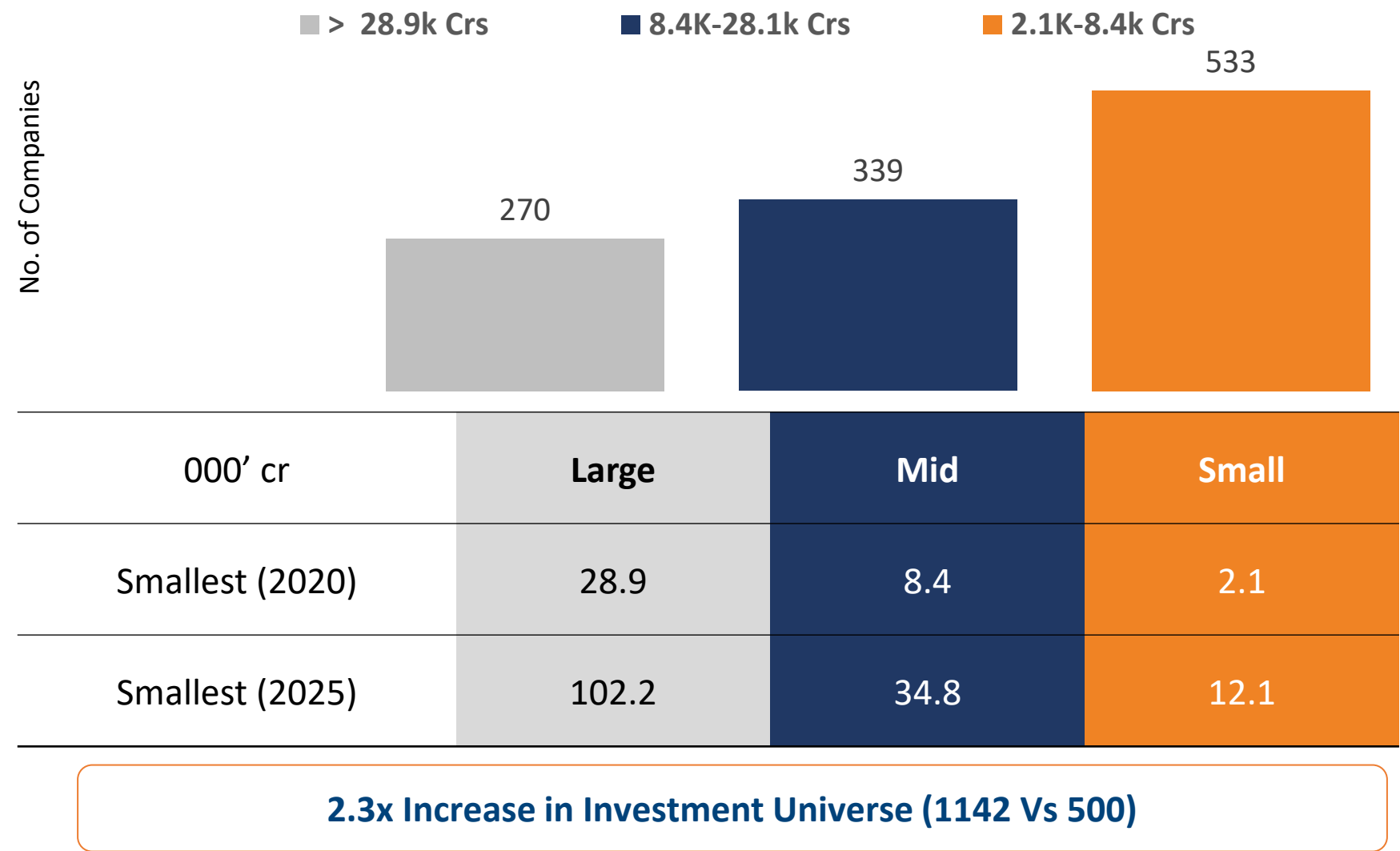

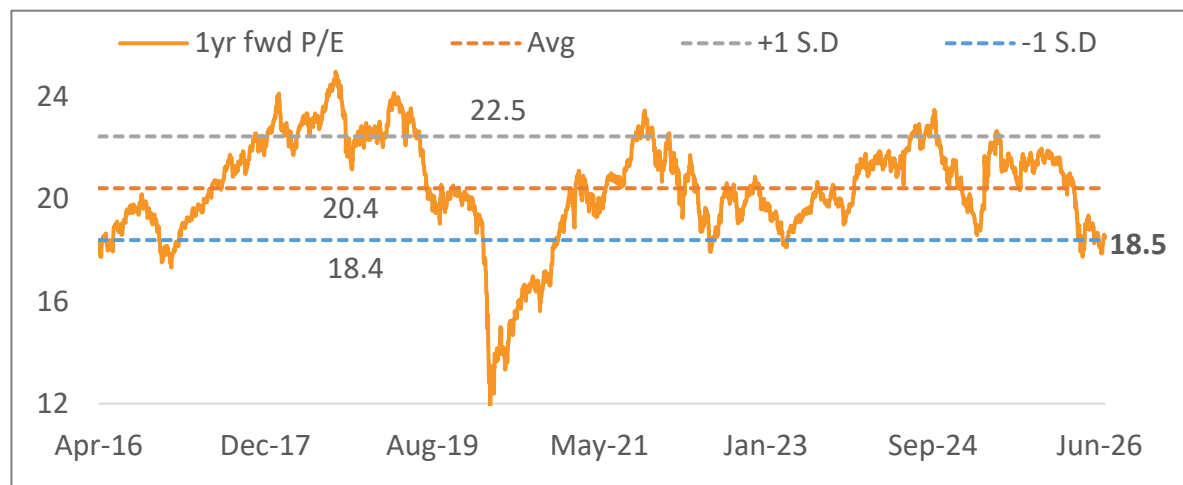

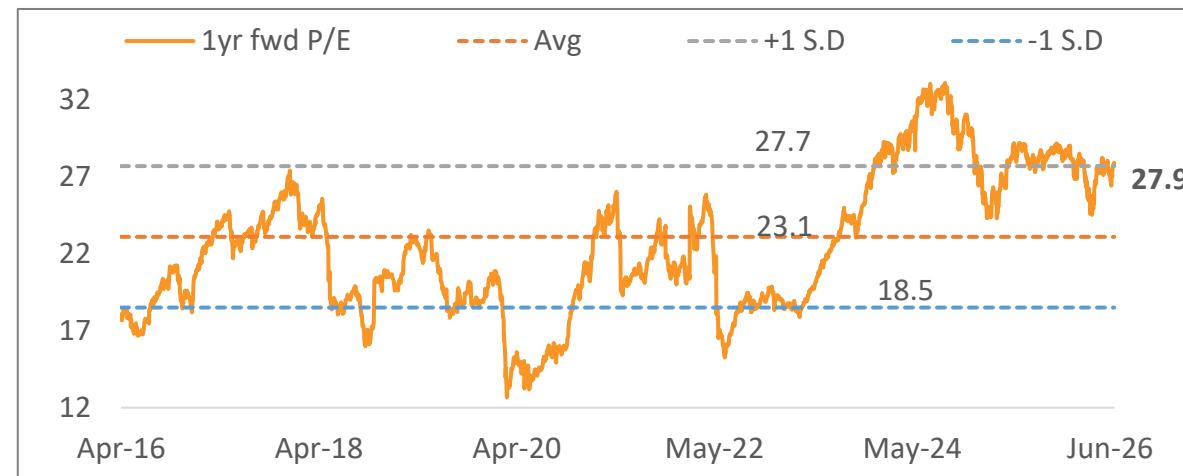

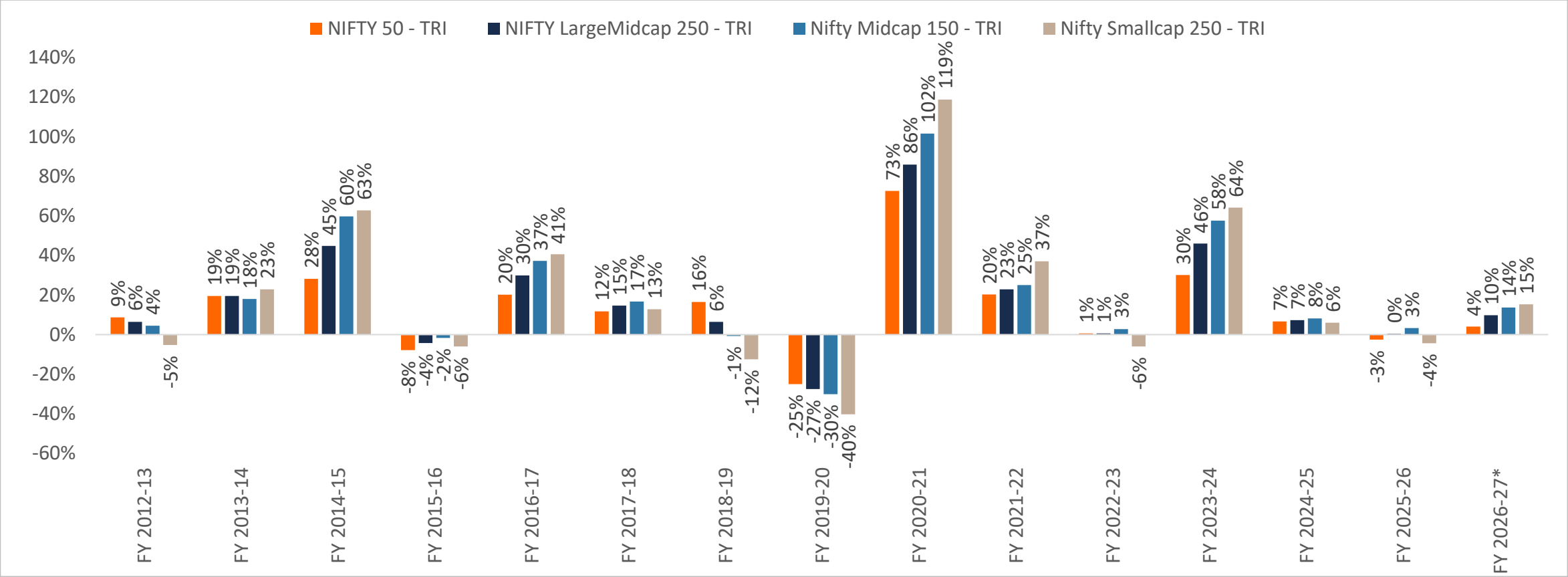

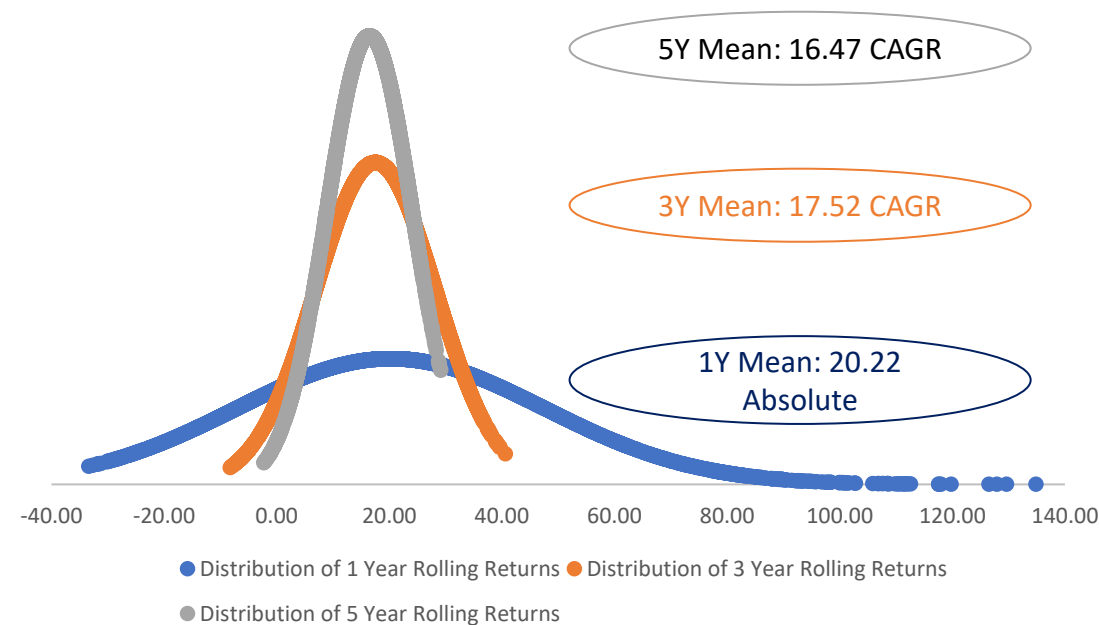
Return Trends in the Mid-Cap Equity Segment

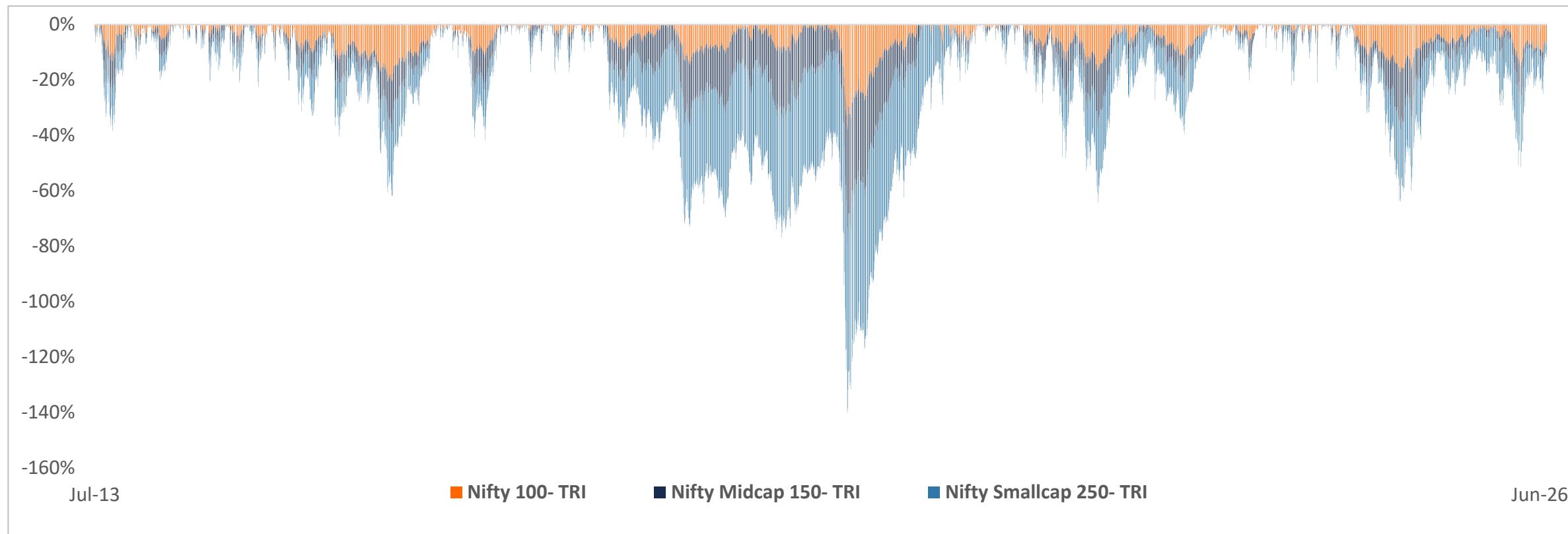

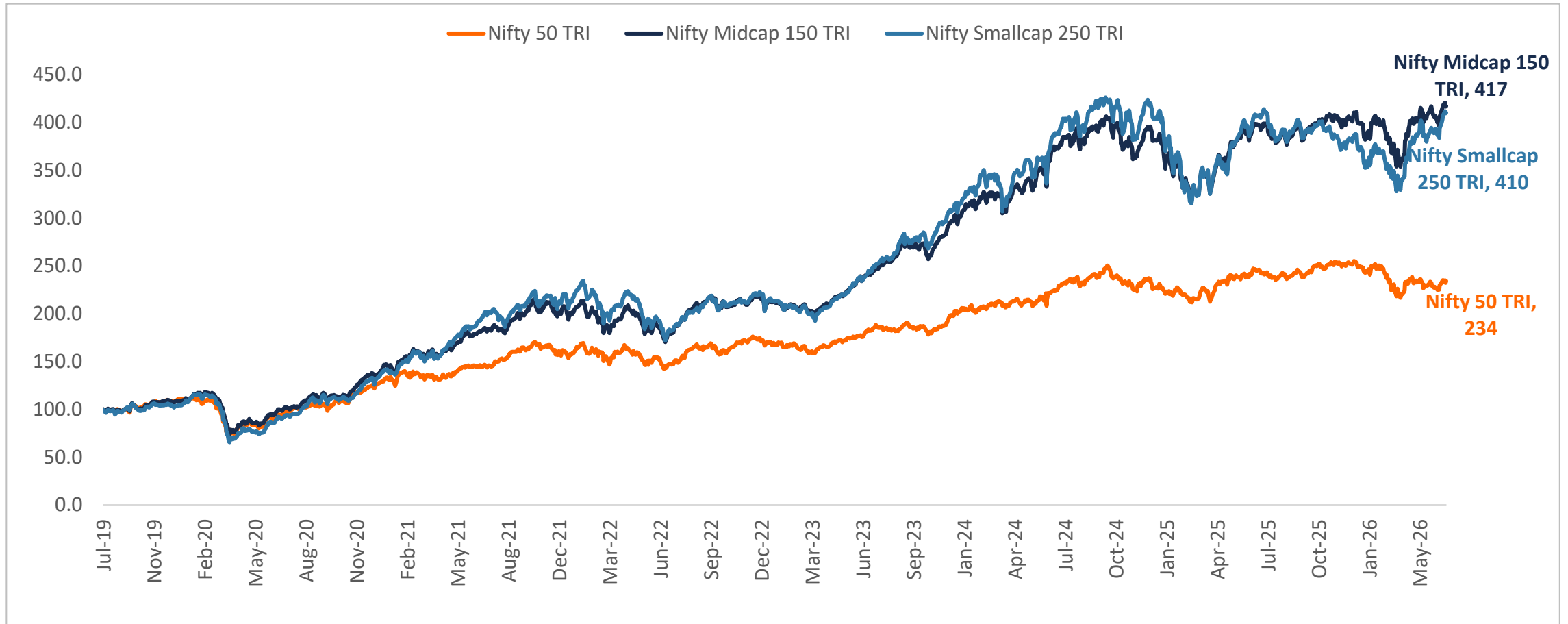

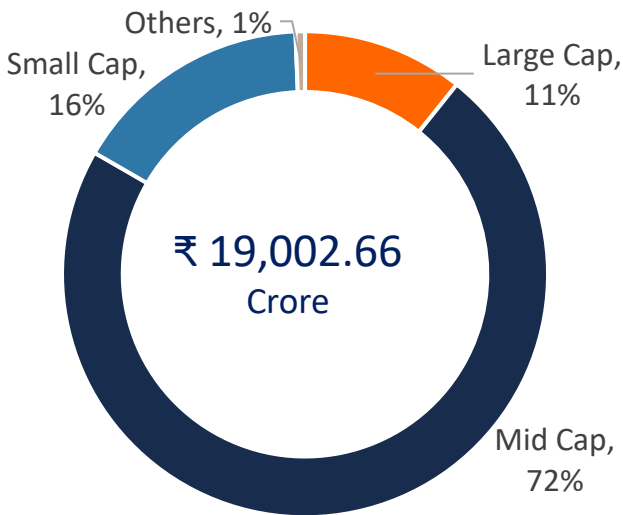

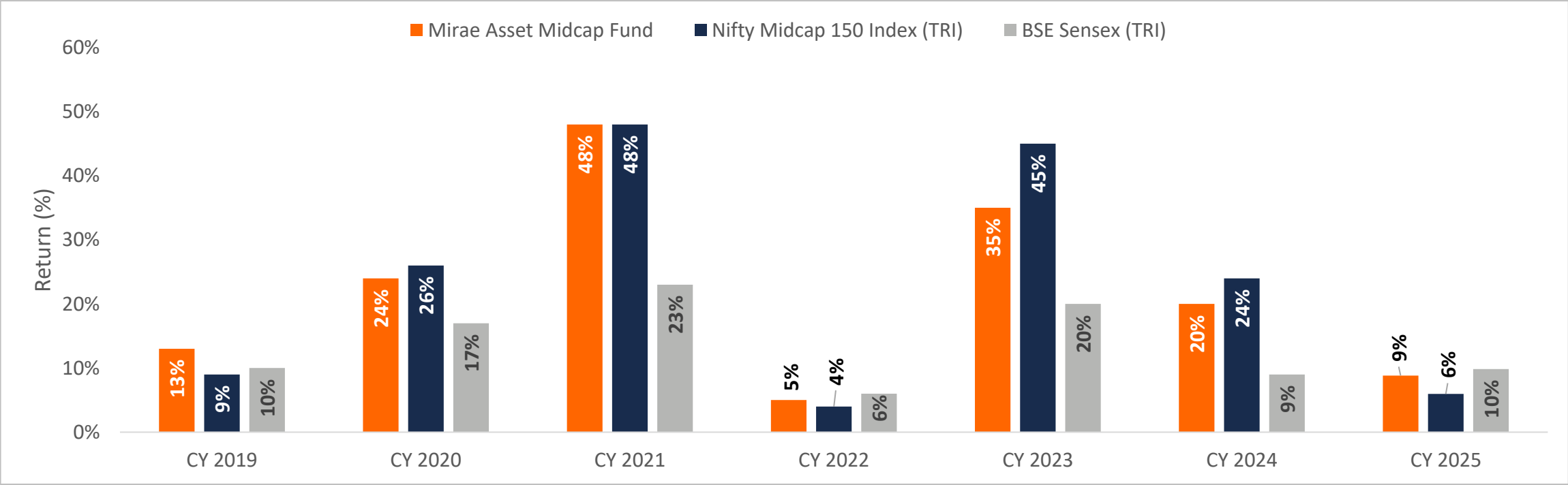

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Performance



Mirae Asset Midcap Fund has demonstrated performance across most periods since inception. Some relative underperformance in 2023 & 2024, in our view, was quotational rather than permanent. The underlying businesses we’ve invested in remain resilient and continue to align with our investment framework. We believe these businesses are well-positioned to create long-term shareholder value and are not structurally impaired.

- **Error of Omission** across certain sectors like – Relatively lower exposure in sectors like Capital Goods, Capital Market and Infrastructure due to discomfort with elevated valuations and limited clarity on sustainability of earnings momentum. This has impacted performance during CY23/24 as market performance during this period was skewed towards these sectors. We have reduced underweight stance to capital markets during CY26 as we do see sustenance of earnings.
- **Error of Commission** - A more significant drag, stemming from high-conviction bets across mass consumption in footwear, consumer durable, CGD, logistics, which faced earning downgrades during CY24. We have taken certain corrective actions while doubling down on many of them where we felt earning downgrades are transient and not structural. This alignment with our investment framework has helped some of these businesses making a strong come back, the same has reflected in the fund performance over last 1-1.5 year.

- Over the past year, performance has rebounded meaningfully as markets recognized the underlying strength of our holdings, leading to broad-based mean reversion. Overweight stance on financials particularly NBFCs, auto ancillary, pharma, and new age businesses across fintech, BPC & logistics etc have aided to the performance. We also made selective corrections where earnings recovery lagged expectations, with a consistent focus on reassessing the portfolio to deliver risk-adjusted returns
- Our current positioning remains largely unchanged. We are positive on financial services particularly private sector banks and well rated NBFCs, supported by improving liquidity, lower interest rates, and a revival in credit growth. Asset quality is benign and valuations remain reasonable. We continue to remain positive on Pharmaceuticals space in segments like – CRO/CDMO where companies are structurally moving up the value chain in terms of their offerings in addition to low cost advantage and strong research capabilities. We are also overweight across sectors like chemical, industrial consumables and export-oriented auto ancillaries as we see improved growth outlook post trade deal announcement with US and EU
- On the other hand, we remain underweight Capital goods and Capital Market businesses due to elevated valuations. We are UW PSU Banks as we do see earnings growth outperformance vs private banks/NBFCs to come down in a more benign liquidity environment. Also, Private Banks and NBFCs are trading at reasonable valuations vs historical averages. Further, we are underweight on relatively low growth segments of the market like – FMCG and IT.

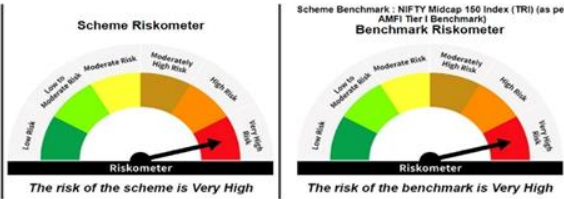
